Human Air Traffic Control Project Lead the Way (For Inver Grove Heights Students Entering Grades 4-5)

The job of managing and controlling airspace falls on the air traffic controllers who coordinate the movements of thousands of airplanes, directing them during takeoffs and landings, as well as keeping them safe distances from each other both in flight and when landing. Students will learn how to use radio protocol and guidelines that NASA astronauts, air traffic controllers, pilots, the military and others use to communicate more effectively. Students will act as an air traffic controller in a simulation that uses radio communication to land model airplanes. Several flight-related field trips are being planned for the afternoons of this camp. Transportation will be provided; more information will be available upon registration.

Driver Education (Age 15 by Sept. 1, 2010)

The state of Minnesota requires anyone under the age of 18 wishing to obtain a driver's license to complete an approved course in driver education. This course must include a minimum of 30 hours of classroom instruction and six hours of behind-the-wheel instruction. The classroom portion includes lecture, discussion, guest speakers, films, written work from textbooks and written tests. The behind-the-wheel portion allows students to practice driving on public streets and highways with

an instructor in a dual-control (two brake) car. Payments can be made in full at the time of registration or in installments of \$175 at the beginning of the class and \$170 at the end of the 30 hours prior to the student receiving the 'blue card.' ***The fee is \$345 if the class begins prior to July 1, 2010. Beginning July 1, 2010, the fee will be \$350. Payments may then be made in installments of \$175.**

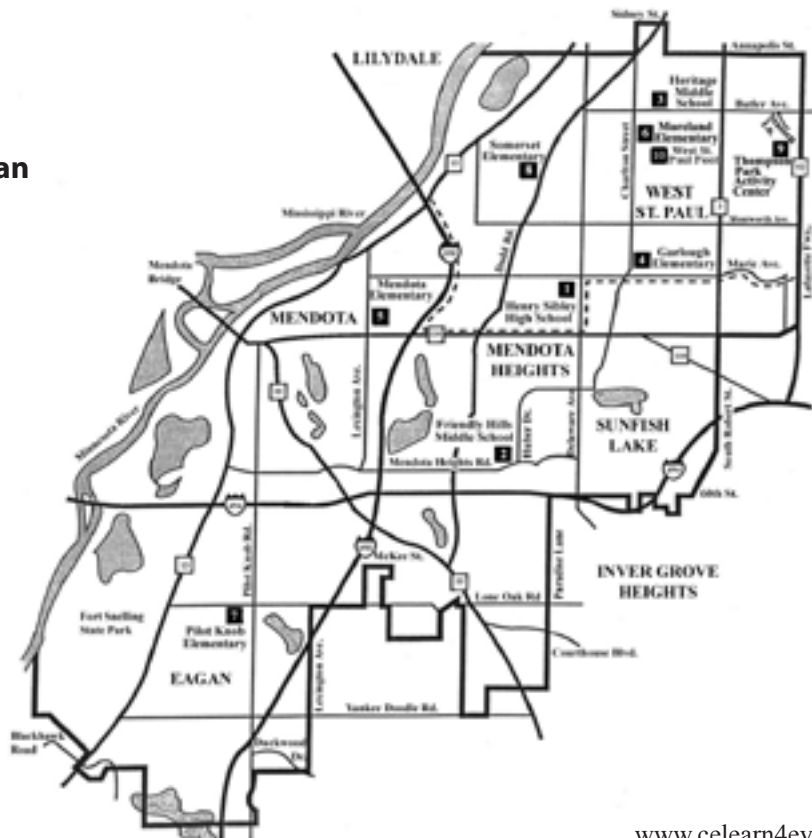
